

Letter from the Interim Moderator

Just imagine the scene not so many years ago. You wanted to buy a selection of groceries. For most it would be Tesco. You wanted that dress for the special occasion. The nearest Marks & Spencer store (much easier to locate than to-day) was your required stop. As a manager you were required to purchase or lease a computer. So you looked no further than IBM. Not too long ago there was a very true saying that "no manager was ever sacked for buying a computer from Big Blue" - as IBM is called.

It is amazing how things change. The advance of Aldi and Lidl has eaten into the major supermarket's share. A few years previous the "experts" told us that the combined sales of Aldi and Lidl would never amount to no more than 5% of the market. It now stands at 16%. It does not pay to fervently believe the "experts". Marks has experienced an almost continuous drop in women's wear sales for the past eight years. IBM simply failed to predict the power and capability of the P.C. Can you recall MFI, Phones4U, Jane Norman, Focus DIY, Zavvi Megastore, Comet, Woolworths, C&A? All names that have now disappeared from the High Street. They got it wrong and paid the penalty. Consumers can be very malicious!

Likewise how many people tend to take for granted all the "popular lines" they get from our Lord? Items for which they are not even asked for a purchase price. *How often does each of us say thanks to God?*

But when the desired stock is sold out. The computer crashes. The food turns mouldy. When they hit a bad patch – who is to blame? It is God. Is our Lord forgotten like the stores just mentioned? Sadly, Christianity is yesterday's stock to many. And we all know that yesterday's supply must be sold off cheaply – or thrown away. And Jesus is treated as severely damaged goods at times. Either the price has been drastically reduced to get rid of them or they are dumped. Because it is a sad fact that so many find it very embarrassing nowadays to have anything whatsoever to do with Jesus. Why is Jesus so side-lined in many areas?

New season's stock is put out for sale at premium prices. High mark-ups to gain maximum profit. This is the paradox. We have a Saviour who is ever new and yet He is often treated as soiled goods. How utterly disparaging it must be for our Saviour to feel like that. This is not new. It is not a 2022 phenomenon. It has been the case since biblical times. Many people simply turned their back on Jesus and walked away. They had no time for Him.

We have the honoured task of promoting our Lord Jesus. We have the most precious Saviour. We "present" our Saviour in different ways. Churches have different concepts or worship and place distinct emphasis upon various aspects of Christian devotion. Most churches do try very hard to present a very attractive package. But where are the customers? The punters are missing. We do not even charge for the goods or the service. People are welcome to come to Church without donating to the offering. Many churches do not even have an offering now as so many give by direct debit or standing order. I went to a church recently and you

were invited to tap the screen to donate £10.00. We have heard it so many times before. Church services are boring. No one makes us welcome. But in the main that is not true. Most Churches go out their way to accommodate newcomers. To make them feel at home, comfortable and at ease. And many sermons are provoking and challenging.

So again let me return to the age old question of why more people do not find the challenge, the comfort and the hope for the future that is found in the Church. Jesus is not spoiled goods. Jesus has never reached, and will never reach, His sell-by date. Many personalities, numerous dictators may have had intimate control over their citizens. But they eventually die. Memories are short lived. To-day children use the memorial to the Romanian dictator Ceausescu as a slide! The grave of Karl Marx is in Highgate cemetery. Once a must-see of the Left Wing. It is now largely abandoned. At one time Ceausescu and Marx were adored, respected and feared. Now where do they stand in the pecking order? The same will happen to Mr Putin. I just pray fervently that the Ukrainians will win. I also feel so sorry for the many Russian soldiers who never wanted to be in Ukraine in the first place.

The memory of Jesus has never died. It is always in Christians' minds. There is only God. There is only one Jesus, the true and only Son of God. *Quite simply there are no substitutes*. You cannot discard God or Jesus and pick up an adequate substitute. Sadly so many shop around for other beliefs, faiths. Many religiously stick to one Church all their lives. But in an age where more and more people are mobile it is simply not feasible. We move to different parts of the country and so go to different Churches.

Again let us revert to our theme. If we were offered cheap and tatty clothes or inedible food we would instantly and quite rightly walk away. How can you possibly say the Lord's Prayer and not believe? Saying "Our Father" surely implies a belief in God? Of course I am not stating that you must believe in God to come to Church. Many attend church for some time before they come to a belief in God. Sadly others attend church but cease to worship because they never find God in church worship.

But let us suppose there were no shopping malls for spreading Christianity. Let us imagine that they did not exist. Let us theorise that churches degenerate into social clubs. What would happen then? Quite simply a vacuum would be created. The one whom we do not hear about very often would simply step and fill the void. I refer to Satan, the Devil.

C. S. Lewis created quite a stir when he published the Screwtape Letters in 1942. The book provides a series of lessons in the importance of taking a deliberate role in Christian faith. It portrays a typical human life, with all its temptations and failings, seen from devils' viewpoints. Screwtape holds an administrative post in the bureaucracy of Hell. He acts as a mentor to Wormwood, the inexperienced, incompetent tempter. In the thirty-one letters which comprise the book, Screwtape gives Wormwood detailed advice on various methods of undermining faith and promoting sin in the "Patient" (a

Christian). Interspersed with observations on human nature and Christian doctrine, individual benefit and greed are seen as the greatest good.

The Bible is crystal clear - waiting to fill any vacuum is Satan. And what a world that would be. No love. No faith. No grace. No good deeds. No caring. No sharing. "Please do not go on," you might say. Yes it is a pretty debilitating scenario. But never fear. Our God will never let us down. Church membership may be falling in Britain but millions of people still follow our God. He seems to be going out of fashion in certain countries. He may be seen as soiled goods. But to His followers He will always be viewed as this season's must-have fashions. His food is always fresh and never reaches its sell-by date. His computers never crash. Because He loves us and will always care for His followers.

Pastorate Matters

A short note to appraise you of the present situation. The three churches in our URC Pastorate successfully went through the scoping process some months previous. Each church is now scoped at one third (of a minister). That process was completed when the pastorate vacancy was declared last September.

The next step in the process is to add our pastorate vacancy to the Moderator's List. That has now been promised in the next few months. At present I cannot give you a firm date. I have to prepare a Pastorate Profile Summary as Interim Moderator. This is a one page document. The pro-forma is presently with the three churches for review. Hopefully the final document will be ready soon. This document will appear on the Eastern Synod web site when our vacancy is added to the Moderator's List. It kindly hosts the Pastoral Profiles on behalf of the Moderators. You can check on existing vacancies by accessing "Pastoral Profile Summaries – URC Eastern Synod" website. The web page is simple to follow. We are in Southern Synod. We trust that our profile will be added to this list by our Moderator in the coming months.

Anyone who is interested in the Pastorate (the necessary qualifications for application are listed on the web page) can approach the respective Synod. They can request a full pastoral profile. In our case it will comprise six documents!! The LMMR (Local Mission & Ministry Review) and Mission Criteria from each church. Should a minister express an interest in our pastorate the vacancy will be automatically closed to any other would-be applicant. The interested minister will complete his/her necessary documents which will be submitted, via Synod, to our Vacancy Committee for consideration. Should our Committee determine, the minister will be invited to meet Committee members at a suitable time and be shown around the three churches. It may be that the minister and/or the Committee feel the Pastorate is unsuitable. Hence interest will cease and our vacancy is again open to any intending applicant. I will stop here, and take up the story when we reach that point. This will be some months down the line.

The Pastorate Committee will have met on 23rd May at Geddes Place. It will consider the construction and scope of the Vacancy Committee. Your representatives will report back on the progress.

Mabomboh Education Project (UK Charity number 1197537)

26th April 2022

Dear friends

Please excuse this blanket request, but this is a project close to my heart.

Mabomboh is a rural village in Sierra Leone. It is quite isolated, and children have to travel about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles each way through rough bush to their nearest school. This is a dangerous and arduous journey, so many of the children only start school at about the age of 8, by which time they have lost years of valuable formal education. Mabomboh Education Project (MEP) has built a school in the village and now offers quality, local pre-school and Primary education for the 100 or so local children.

Teachers have been appointed and the school successfully opened in January of this year. The issue that is now faced is that of accommodation for the teachers. The teachers are not local and have been renting rooms in local homes. Sadly, this is not a long-term solution. Daily commuting is out of the question as the trip is nearly 2 hours each way and the roads are very poor.

MEP has decided that, in order to retain the teachers, we will build 3 blocks of 2 units each, to provide accommodation to the teachers at the school. These will be rented to the teachers, but the income (in UK terms) is not enough to pay for the buildings. It will, however, serve to maintain and repair the buildings as needed. MEP can pay for the building of 2 of these blocks, providing accommodation for 4 teachers.

MEP is looking to raise £8,000 towards the building of the third block. If you can make any contribution towards this project, it would be most gratefully received. Please look at the links below for more information on the project and on how you can donate to this worthy cause.

From the Treasurer

On Sunday 15th May I presented Emmanuel accounts for the year ending August 31st 2021 at a Church meeting following morning service. The congregation unanimously accepted the accounts and they were duly signed. Our grateful thanks go to Samantha Palmer who works hard to prepare the accounts each year.

It was pointed out that there has been a noticeable decrease in the final amount in the bank accounts since 2020. This was mainly as a result of the pandemic. The income from lettings had fallen considerably.

Although money has started coming in, in view of the forthcoming rise in the cost of electricity and gas, estimated at an extra £2,500 pa (44%), the Elders are worried that our funds will be severely affected. It is intended to raise the hiring charges for the hall.

Although there are at present no plans for refurbishment, Emmanuel is an old building and needs quite a lot of maintenance. Repairs come at a cost and we are committed to an annual Church assessment payment of £13,700 to the Circuit. We need to find ways of raising money to ensure the balance of our accounts will meet our needs.

As treasurer, I feel very concerned for the future financial situation of our Church.

Thanks to your support the charity distributed over 10,000 Christmas boxes to disadvantaged children in Moldova, they would not have had Christmas presents without your kindness and as usual the boxes bought such happiness to all the children.

On behalf of all the children you have helped 'Thank you' I can assure you each and every box was cherished. I would also like to 'Thank you' also for contributing to over 10,000 smiles.

With the devastating humanitarian crisis that is now unfolding across eastern Europe we have decided that this year's love in a Box will be suspended. We need to help in a more direct way as soon as we can. Moldova has in the last fortnight received more refugees per head than any other country. It is also only 30 miles from the Ukraine city of Odesa.

Therefore we are requesting that instead of donating the usual £4 per box we can do more to help by accepting donations instead.
